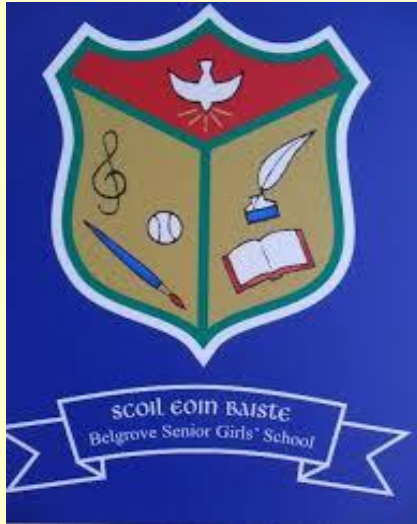




ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THIRD CLASS TEACHERS

School Requirements

Your child will need the following supplies this year:

1. Pared HB pencils
2. Coloured pencils and crayons
3. Eraser and pencil sharpener

The pencil case must be left in school

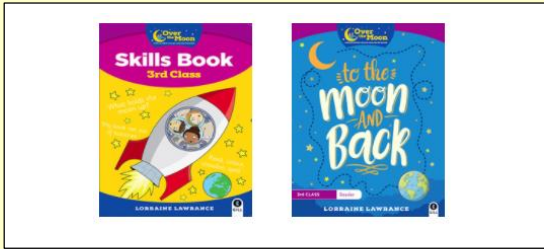
Homework

Homework is an essential part of your child's learning. It reinforces what she has learned in class that day. It is important she completes it fully, ideally in a quiet environment without distractions. In Third Class we encourage each child to develop her organisational skills in relation to her homework.

This year the girls will have traditional homework ie Mental Maths and also online homework through **Seesaw** and e-books online. This is in effort to reduce the amount of books being brought home and also to help the girls gain the technology skills needed, should there be further restrictions or closures.

Oral homework is as important as written homework. Third Class homework should take roughly 30-40 minutes of consistent work. All journals should be signed by a parent/guardian every night after checking that homework has been completed accurately.

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Reading

Homework reading must be read **aloud** for you every night. If your child has difficulty with a word, help her to break it into syllables and sound it out. If this fails, tell her the word and ask her to read the sentence again. At the end of the reading session, chat with your child about the content of what she has read.

We cannot over emphasise the importance of developing a love of reading at this stage.

Reading material should always be at your child's reading level. Read to your child, read with your child (paired reading), let your child read to you. Make it fun!

We encourage 15minutes reading for pleasure every night.



Spelling

The children are encouraged to learn spelling using the “**Look and Say, Cover, Write, Check**” method. The actual writing down of each spelling using the spelling strategies they have been taught in class, is a very important part of the learning process. Their spellings will be checked on an on-going basis through dictation exercises.

Weekly spellings are taken from Brendan Culligan’s Core Word List, our class reader. In addition to this each child is maintaining a personal spelling wall.

English Writing

We encourage the children to be accurate with sentence structure, punctuation, spellings and grammar.

In order to promote self-expression and fluidity of ideas during creative writing, all mistakes may not be corrected.

Handwriting

Neat hand writing is expected in classwork, homework and in project work. The neat layout of work is an important skill. This is reinforced in class on a daily basis and should be encouraged at home.

Joined writing will be continued through the Go with the Flow programme.

This will be done in the workbook to begin with and will progress to copy books later in the year.

Gaeilge

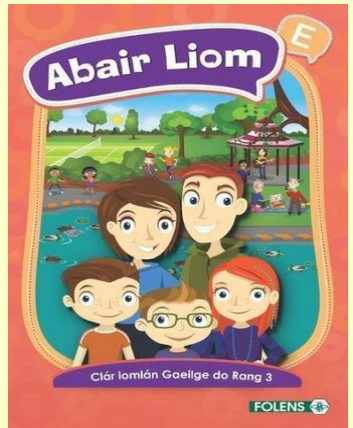

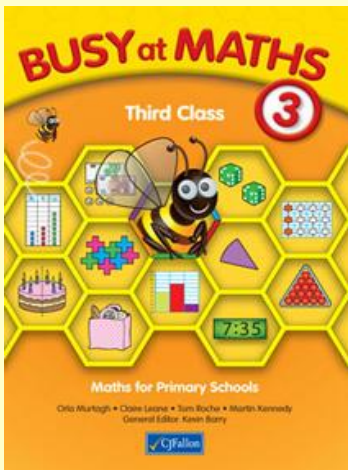
Please use the online recordings to practice reading, this will help with pronunciation. Formal reading and writing of Irish are introduced this year along with simple Irish spellings.

We are trialing SingFónaic; an Irish phonics programme to assist with Irish reading and pronunciation.

Be positive and bain úsáid as the “cúpla focal” whenever possible!



Maths



The Maths programme in Third Class is extensive. It incorporates the introduction of multiplication and division. The learning of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division tables is **essential**.

Tables can be learned, as spellings are, using the “**Look and Say, Cover, Write, Check**” method. Additional resources are available on the school website.

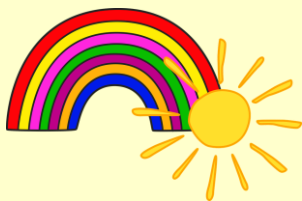
Check your child’s Maths homework each night. If she is having a problem doing it, or has been unable to complete it, please put a note in her Homework Notebook.

Many Maths topics can be carried out informally. Help your child to:

- Read the time both in digital and analogue.
- Be familiar with coin values and be aware of change when shopping.
- Understand fractions when sharing.

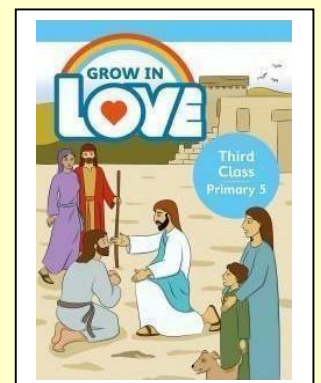
S.P.H.E

Assessment

Standardised Tests -The MICRA-T Level 2 Reading Test is usually administered in September and The Sigma-T Maths Test is administered at the end of the school year.

Currently we are awaiting DES guidelines in relation to these.

Class based tests are important ways to communicate, please sign and return to school to keep informed of your daughter's progress.



Seesaw

Our school is using the online platform to help facilitate blended and distance learning. It is a fantastic way for students to submit work and receive feedback from their teachers.



Project Work

Don't Stress! Projects at this stage are usually 2 scrapbook pages long, about 10 facts and pictures. Keep it simple and in the childrens' own words. Encourage neat and tidy presentation. Guidelines will often be put on the Class Blog.
