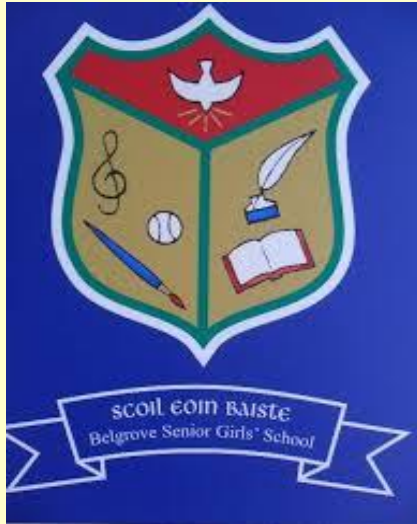

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM FIFTH CLASS TEACHERS



### Introduction

Your daughter is now in the Senior Cycle of the Primary School Curriculum. This year is about encouraging your daughter to take ownership of her own work and learning, as she begins the transition towards secondary school.

### School Requirements

Your child will need the following supplies this year:

1. Pared HB pencils
2. Coloured pencils and crayons
3. Eraser and pencil sharpener
4. Ruler & Pritt Stick
5. Art Shirt
6. Whiteboard markers
7. Highlighters
8. Maths set & calculator

**The pencil case must be left in school**

### Homework

Homework is an essential part of your child's learning. It reinforces what she has learned in class that day. It is important she completes it fully and correctly. In Fifth Class we encourage each child to develop her organisational skills in relation to her homework.

This year the girls will have traditional homework ie Mental Maths, copy work and occasional online homework through **Seesaw** and e-books online.

Oral homework is as important as written homework. Fifth Class homework should normally take roughly 50 - 60 minutes of consistent work. All journals should be signed by a parent/guardian every night after checking that homework has been completed accurately.

## Reading

Homework reading should be read **aloud** for you. If your child has difficulty with a word, help her to break it into syllables and sound it out. If this fails, tell her the word and ask her to read the sentence again. At the end of the reading session, chat with your child about the content of what she has read. We cannot over emphasise the importance of developing a love of reading at this stage.

Reading material should always be at your child's reading level. Read to your child, read with your child (paired reading), let your child read to you. Make it fun!

We encourage 20 minutes reading for pleasure every night.



## Spelling

The children are encouraged to learn spelling using the “**Look and Say, Cover, Write, Check**” method. Their spellings will be checked on an on-going basis through dictation exercises.

Weekly spellings are taken from Brendan Culligan’s Core Word List, our class reader and novel or from the child’s own reading. In addition to this each child is maintaining a personal spelling record.

## English Writing

We encourage the children to be accurate with sentence structure, punctuation, spellings and grammar.

In order to promote self-expression and fluidity of ideas and creative writing, all mistakes may not be corrected.

## Handwriting

Neat hand writing is expected in classwork, homework and in project work. The neat layout of work is an important skill. This is reinforced in class on a daily basis and should be encouraged at home.

Joined writing will be continued through the Go with the Flow programme. The girls will progress to using pen later in the year both in the workbook and copybooks.

## Gaeilge

The revised curriculum has a strong emphasis on oral language. We would encourage each child to use the phrases and vocabulary she learns in school at home. These can be found on *Abair Liom online*. (Login instructions on the school website - subjects - Gaeilge)

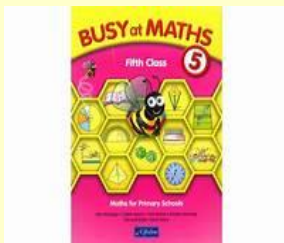

## Maths



The Maths programme in Fifth class is extensive. It incorporates the introduction of many new concepts, such as long division. The work completed in Fifth class forms the basis of the maths curriculum in Sixth class. The learning of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division tables is **essential**.

Tables can be learned, as spellings are, using the “*Look and Say, Cover, Write, Check*” method. Additional resources are available on the school website.

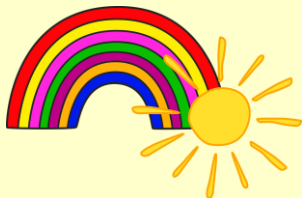

Check your child's Maths homework each night. If she is having a problem doing it, or has been unable to complete it, please put a note in her Homework Journal.

Many Maths topics can be carried out informally. Help your child to:

- Read the time both in digital and analogue.
- Be familiar with coin values and be aware of change when shopping.
- Understand fractions when sharing.

All journals should be signed every night after checking that homework has been completed accurately.

## Assessment

Standardised Tests -The MICRA-T Level 4 Reading Test is usually administered in September and The Sigma-T Maths Test is administered at the end of the school year.

Class based tests are important ways to communicate, please sign and return to school to keep informed of your daughter's progress.



## Project Work

Don't Stress! Keep it simple and in the childrens' own words. Encourage neat and tidy presentation. Guidelines will often be put on Seesaw. Your child will also receive instructions and support in class.
