English:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jolly Grammar: Page 48 - Practise new sound ('ear') & learn the first 3 spellings. Try think of other words that have the 'ear' sound and write them into the teardrops. Complete top half of page (fill in the blanks and the teardrops) • Over the Moon: Read pages 115 – 117 out loud to someone (focus on expression and pausing at commas/full stops) • Skills book: Page 112 Part A – find the answers in the story and write them into the book. Remember to use full sentences! • DEAR (Drop Everything and Read): minimum 20 minutes
