3. A bus fare is €1.85 per student.

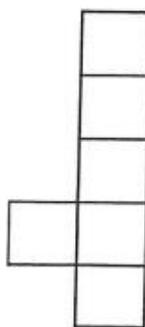
(a) Find the fare for four students. €7.40

Aisling pays the fare for the four students with a €10 note.

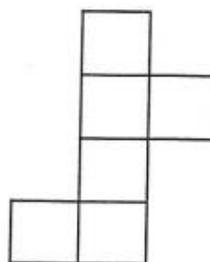
(b) How much change should she get? €2.60



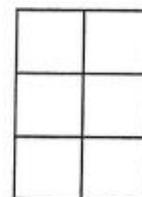
4. Which of the shapes A, B, or C is a correct net of a cube?

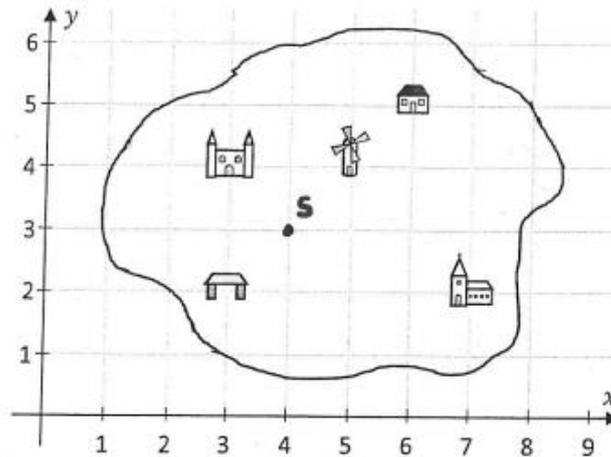

- (a) In the table below, write in the co-ordinates of each building. One has been done already.

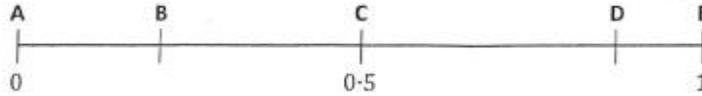

6. The probability of each of the events A, B, C, D, and E is shown on the probability scale below.



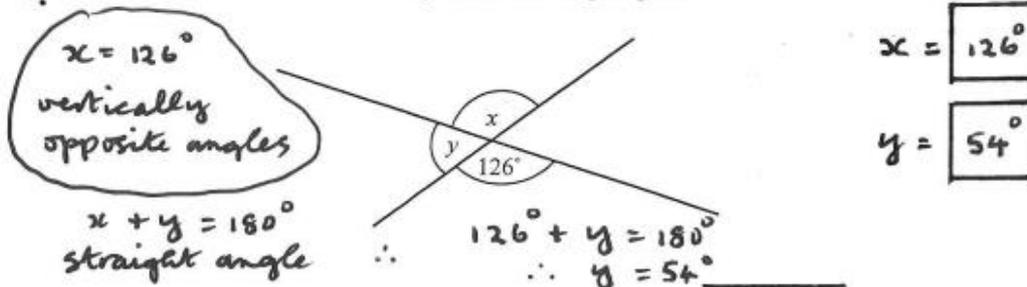
(a) Fill in the table below to show which word or phrase best describes how likely each event is to happen. One has already been filled in.

The Tourist Trail

Section A - Complete ANY five questions

1. The first street on the left is Saint Andrew's Street.
2. The Thingmote was on the site of Saint Andrew's Church.
3. The Stock Exchange can be found on Anglesea Street.
4. The theatre close to the Central Bank is the Olympia Theatre.
5. The City Hall was built in 1769 by Thomas Cooley.
6. The old Smock Alley Theatre was on Essex Street.
7. The main courtyard of Dublin Castle is called the Upper Castle Yard.
8. Dublin Castle was first used as a stronghold for the rulers of Ireland.
9. Today, Dublin Castle runs guided tours for the public. It is also used ceremonially by the Government.
10. State Apartments are closed to the public during visits by foreign rulers and summits of the European Community.

Section B

O'Connell Street in the **centre** of Dublin was once known as **Sackville** Street. In 1794 the construction of Carlisle Bridge across the Liffey **linked** the north and south sides of the city. A tall **column** with a statue of Lord Nelson on top was **constructed** in 1815 in O'Connell Street. The statue was destroyed by an **explosion** in 1966 which marked the 50th anniversary of the Easter Rising. There are a number of important **statues** lining the centre of O'Connell Street. Among the best known statues are those of Daniel O'Connell and Jim Larkin. Jim Larkin was a great trade **union** leader. At the top of O'Connell Street stands the statue of Charles **Stewart** Parnell. On that statue is the **inscription** 'No man has a right to fix the boundary of the march of a nation. No man has a right to say, "Thus far shalt thou go and no further".'
